improve consumer protection for Georgia families. Identity theft occurs when a thief uses someone else’s name and SSN to fill out a credit application, often for a credit card. Identity theft is a serious problem in our country and in our state. In 2008, there

were 15 data breaches in the state of Georgia, exposing the personal identification of 300,000 Georgians.
